## Classes and participation restrictions

ESOC/JWSOC/EYSOC has different classes: W21, M21, W17, M17, W20, M20

All competitors represent a National Federation.

A competitor may represent only one National Federation during any one 12 month period running from November to October. Competitors shall have full passport-holding citizenship of the country of the National Federation they are representing.

ESOC/WC:

Each Federation may enter a team of an unlimited number of competitors and a number of team officials. Each Federation may enter up to 6 women and 6 men in each individual competition. In addition, each Federation may enter up to a further 2 women and 2 men, who qualify for the Women U23 and Men U23 classes respectively.

In the Sprint Relay, each Federation may enter up to 3 teams, each consisting of 2 competitors. Each team must contain at least one woman. Athletes entered to the JWSOC or the EYSOC may complement Sprint Relay teams. All competitors must have a valid IOF Athlete Licence. Please ensure that the Athlete Licence fees are paid before the competitions.

JWSOC:

Each Federation may enter a team of up to 14 competitors - up to 7 women and up to 7 men - and an unlimited number of team officials.

In each individual competition, each Federation may enter up to 6 women and 6 men. In the relay, each Federation may enter up to 2 women's and 2 men's teams, each consisting of 3 team members.

If a Federation is unable to make up full relay teams, it may form incomplete teams or teams with competitors from other federations. Under no circumstances may persons, other than competitors entered for the competition, participate in the competition, with the exception of athletes entered to the EYSOC, who may complement JWSOC relay teams.

EYSOC:

Competitors representing member Federations of the IOF, defined by the International Olympic Committee as belonging to the European continent, can compete in EYSOC. Competitors representing other member Federations of the IOF can participate in EYSOC but will not be eligible for European titles, medals or diplomas.

Each Federation may enter a team of up to 14 competitors - up to 7 women and up to 7 men - and an unlimited number of team officials. For each individual competition a Federation may enter a maximum of 6 competitors in each class.

In the relay, each Federation may enter up to 2 women's and 2 men's teams, each consisting of 3 team members.

# Event information

## ACCREDITATION

Team officials should upon arrival show up at the event office in Event centre, (see programme for opening hours) to receive accreditation badges, info bags and emiTag-cards for their teams.

## FOOD

Lunch and café services will be available at the event center on competition days from Thursday 20.3. to Sunday 23.3.. Those who have pre-booked lunch can collect their lunch tickets from the race info. It is also possible to purchase lunch tickets from the race info during the competitions. The price for lunch is 12€ per person.

## WAXING FACILITIES AND SKI WAXING SERVICE

Waxing facilities are available near the competition arena right next to the quarantine area and ski-test area. The waxing facility is next to the parking area. These have electrical connections and lockable. Facility is lockable but the areas are only separated by light walls. During quarantine there are no communication devices allowed also in waxing cabins. Access control is in place in the waxing area and only accredited personnel are allowed to enter the waxing facility.

## FIRST AID

First aid service and transport of injured athletes from the forest is available. The first aid station is located at the event center. The event's first aid officer is Antti Pietilä and his phone number is +35840 7511 270. In case of emergency, call the emergency number 112.

## PRIZE GIVING CEREMONIES

The prize giving ceremony takes place daily after the competitions have ended. The prize giving ceremony is held outdoors in front of the Pentik Gallery. A more detailed schedule for the prize giving ceremony can be found in the competition program. It is easy to walk from the competition center to the prize giving ceremony location.

## TRAINING AND MODEL EVENT

Training is possible on the trails outside the embargo area. Up-to-date information about the maintained ski trails in the Posio area can be found at [www.infogis.fi/posio](http://www.infogis.fi/posio). In Kirintövaara, approximately 7 km east of the competition center, there is a model event tracks. The official model event will be held on Wednesday 19.3. from 10:00 to 14:00, but the course can also be used before and after the model event.

## SKI-TESTING

Testing skis is possible on the ski trails outside the embargo area. There is a ski testing area at the near of the competition area and within the quarantine area, where warming up is also possible during the competitions.

## COMPETITION ENTRY

JWSOC and EYSOC have three seeding groups each. Team leaders are responsible for allocating their athletes to these seeding groups. The allocation of athletes to seeding groups should be done in Eventor. The principles for allocating athletes to seeding groups are defined in rule 9.14 of the IOF Ski Orienteering Competition Rules 2024.

## TEAM OFFICIALS MEETING

Team officials meetings will be held at the Posio Town Hall, address Kirkkotie 1, 97900 Posio. The meetings will take place in the evenings at 19:00 Finnish time before the next day's competition. The first team officials meeting will be held on Wednesday 19.3. at 19:00. It is also possible to participate in the meetings via Teams. The meeting link will be sent to the teams' shared WhatsApp group. Presentations from the meetings will be uploaded to IOF Eventor once the meeting is finished.

## START LISTS

Start lists will be distributed at team official meetings and uploaded to IOF Eventor on the evening before each race.

## NUMBER BIBS

Relay competition bibs can be picked up from the race info starting Thursday 20.3. at 9:30. Bibs for individual competitions can be picked up from the quarantine area.

## TOILETS AND SHOWERS

There are indoor and outdoor toilet facilities in the competition area. Toilets are also available in the quarantine area. Dressing rooms, toilets, and showers in the ice-hockey hall at the competition center are reserved for competitors and are available daily.

## PARKING

Parking is available at the quarantine area. Please follow the signs and instructions of the parking marshals. Parking is free of charge. You should walk along the pedestrian pathway between the parking area and the competition center. The distance between the parking area and the competition center is 600 meters.

## PUNCHING

Emit touch free punching system will be used. All competitors will be equipped with two emiTags from the organizer. Private EmiTags will not be allowed in the World cup. The main tags have numbers 3001-3300 and have yellow wrist band. The back up tags have numbers 2001-2300 and have red wrist band. The runners shall wear the two tag on the same arm, and the main tag with a yellow band closest to the hand. Athletes cannot put the two tags on the same wrist band

# Event information

## QUARANTINE

The quarantine zone is common for all competition days. The distance between the quarantine area and the competition center is 600 meters. All athletes must pass through the quarantine on their way to the start. Please remember to take your accreditation badge with you! Quarantine opens 1 hour before the first start.

The quarantine area includes heated spaces, pre-booked waxing cabins, warmup area, ski testing area and toilets. The route to the start is taped from the quarantine. Once the entrance to the quarantine is closed only event organizers and marshals are permitted to enter the area, this means that team leaders, waxers, etc. who plan to be present in the quarantine area must be there before the quarantine closes. Any athlete or team official leaving the quarantine area after entrance has been closed will not be permitted back in. Please note that telephones, tablets, computers or other electronic equipment are not permitted within the quarantine.

When leaving quarantine for the start, you can leave your bag in a specially designated area and collect it after your finish. The competition organization will arrange transportation for equipment from the quarantine area to the finish area.

The quarantine will close as follows: on

Friday 21.3. at 10:00

Saturday 22.3. at 10:00

Sunday 23.3. at 9:30.

Entry to the quarantine area must be registered with an official who records all entrants. The quarantine opens daily one hour before the closing time for check-in to the quarantine area.

## MAPS AFTER FINISH

Maps will not be collected after finishing. Maps left at map exchange will be made available at the race office.

## COMPLAINS AND PROTESTS

Complaint can be made to organiser max. 15 minutes after official results have been published. Complaint can be done by team official or competitor. Protest can be made to organizer max. 15 minutes after organiser has informed the complainant of the decision about the Complaint. Complaint and protest forms can be found at competition office.

## GPS

All athletes in ESOC shall carry a GPS-unit. GPS trackers will be used daily in the men's and women's categories (MEN, WOMEN). GPS trackers for Thursday's relay will be distributed starting at 10:00 near the starting area. In individual competitions, GPS trackers will be distributed daily at the starting location.

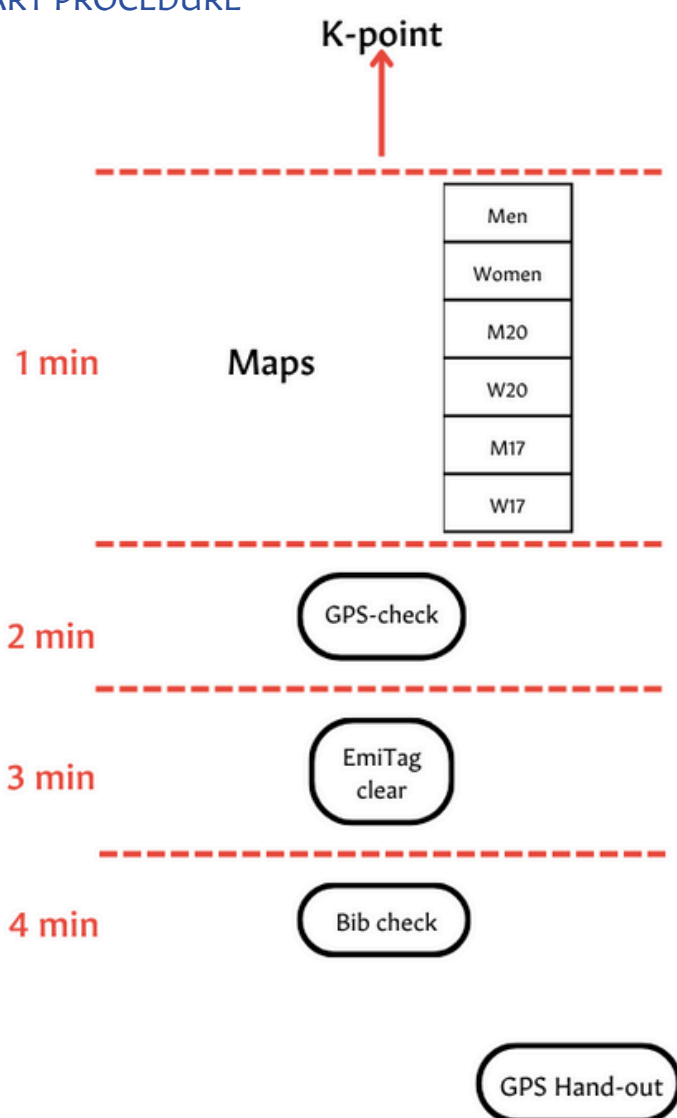

## ANTI-DOPING

Doping is strictly forbidden. Doping controls may be carried out any time during the competition period. Selected athletes will be given instruction to report to the doping control after finishing their race, and will be escorted by an organizer. Athletes selected for the doping tests must bring an official identification document (with photo) to the doping test area.

## Payments

Following the deadline for registering the number of participants and team officials (-2 months), the event organizer will issue invoices for accreditations, entry registration and waxing areas.

## Permitted deviations from the rules

- The IOF Ski Orienteering Rules nov 2024, Appendix 9 address the European Ski Orienteering Championships. Contrary to the rules (section 2), there will be no regular relay competition in Posio (classes M21 / W21) and all individual competitions will be held with interval starts.
- There will be no opening or closing ceremonies at the event.
- Map exchange or map flipping may be used in the competitions.

Waxing facilities are available near the competition arena right next to the quarantine area. Electrical connections and heating is provided. 15m<sup>2</sup> and 10m<sup>2</sup> areas are available at the waxing facility. Facility is lockable but the areas are only separated by light walls. Price for one 15m<sup>2</sup> waxing area is 600€ and the 10m<sup>2</sup> price is 500€. Availability is first come-first served.

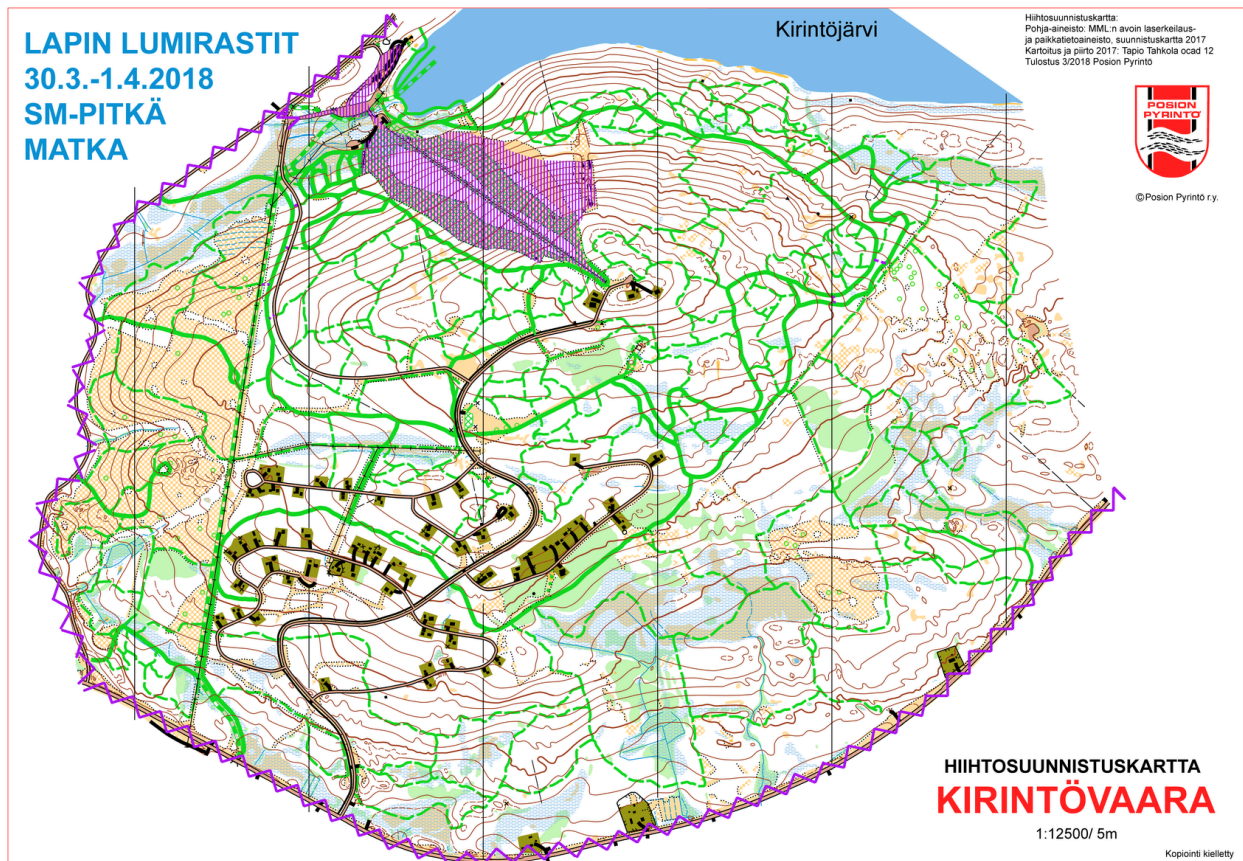
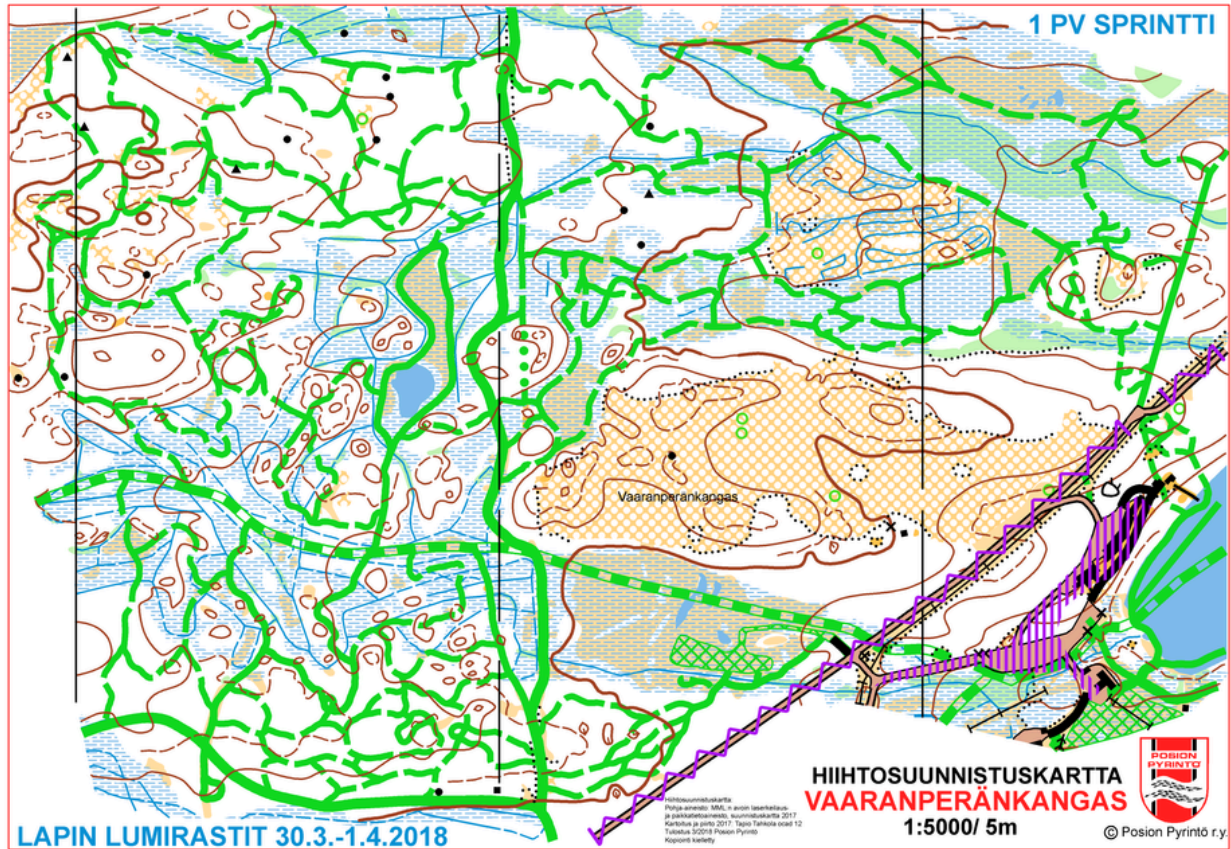
